Dianella revoluta 'DTN03' PP18,883 - Diminutive form of flax lily, small in stature, with an upright to arched habit and gray blue foliage. Don't let it's petite appearance fool you... this plant is tough! Super low water needs and loves the sun and heat. Ideal for low maintenance landscapes and a great choice as the focal point for water wise containers. Small violet flowers borne on tall stems in spring. Best suited to Western gardens but can work in the Southeast if kept "dry".



CROP TIME:

1-gal: 4-5 months from liners
3-gal: 7-9 months from liners

*depending on inputs & climate



SALES STRATEGY:

Blue foliage, a small size and architectural habit, combined with heat & drought tolerance, mean season-long sales appeal.



LANDSCAPE NICHE:

In Zones 8b and warmer, will add color interest to any low maintenance garden, especially in arid climates!



CONTAINER APP:

Absolutely! Use in low-water mixed containers to add texture and of course color!



Dianella Baby Bliss™



Foliage:

- Narrow strap-leaf foliage with a smooth texture and high glaucosity.
- Leaves are "blue" to gray-blue; color is more intense in dry, full sun positions.



Habit:

- 18 in H x 18 in W; upright to arched foliage habit
- Growth rate is slower than some larger Dianella
- Zones 8 - 11 for landscape applications; may also work in slightly colder regions if protected



Apps:

- Aply suited for general landscape conditions in the Western US and low water applications in the Southeastern US. Great as a border, a specimen, in mass or even in mixed containers.



Bloom:

- Branched inflorescence appear in spring and sit high above the foliage, giving rise to dozens of small violet flowers with prominent yellow anthers.

Notables:

- LIKES - Well drained soils, heat, and full sun.
- DISLIKES - Combo of high humidity & over-watering

- Drought tolerant foliage plant with unique color that is ideally suited to water-wise gardens & containers.
