

Westringia fruticosa 'WES06' PPAF - Our smallest groundcover form of coastal rosemary. Best suited to Zones 9-11 in arid climates although shows potential for low water gardens in humid regions. Selected from our already-diminutive variety we call "Mundi", Low Horizon has essentially the same habit and color only in a dwarfed package, reaching only about two-thirds the size of the parent.



CROP TIME:

6-9 mos. from liners 1-gal: 2/3-gal: 12+ mos. from liners 5/7-gal: 18+ months *depending on inputs & climate



SALES STRATEGY:

Sell as a drought & salt tolerant groundcover shrub with a nice flower display from early spring to summer. Good for retail!

Westringia Low Horizon



Leaf:

- Small, rosemary-like leaves arranged in whorls along the branches
- · Young growth is light gray-green; matures to a dark gray-green with a smooth texture.



Habit:

- 1 ft H x 4 ft W; decumbent growth habit
- · Quick to finish & easily established in the garden
- Zones 9-11; confidently evergreen in 9b -11

- Responds well to pruning

Bloom: Snow-white, quarter-sized flowers appear in small clusters along the stems from late winter to summer and sporadically throughout the season. A definite sales feature in spring/summer.
