

Dianella tasmanica 'TR20' PP18,737 - A broad-bladed flax lily with a wide range of applications: plant in full sun for vivid lime foliage and an upright to arched habit, or plant in the shade for dark green, weeping foliage. Red pigmentations are seen from crown to leaf and become more pronounced in cool weather for added winter interest. Spring brings a typical Dianella bloom but with very large and ornate berries. Best suited to Western gardens.



CROP TIME:

4-6 months from liners 1-gal: 3-gal: 6-9 months from liners

*depending on inputs & climate



SALES STRATEGY:

Sell as a low-maintenance groundcover; unique foliage color and springtime flower and berries will add to the appeal.

Foliage: • Broad, strappy leaves; lime green to green-yellow in full sun and dark green in shade. In cooler months, hues of maroon and red radiate up from the crown through the foliage



Habit:

- 1.5-2 ft H x 1.5-2 ft W (+/-); taller in shade
- Zone 8b-11; Evergreen in Zone 9 and warmer
- · Clumping to slow-spreading perennial with an arched habit in full sun & weeping habit in shade



Apps:

- Group, Border or Specimen Plantings; Containers
- Water-wise Home & Commercial Gardens
- Best suited to Western gardens but will adapt to subtropic conditions with proper care.



Bloom:

·Clusters of small purple flowers borne on branched peduncles that sit high above the foliage. Much larger berries than other Dianella varieties

Notables:

·LIKES - Deep & infrequent irrigation, sun & shade

DISLIKES - Overwatering, excessive moisture/humidity

Sales Niche: In western climates: a low-maintenance & drought tolerant groundcover; great for mass plantings.



LANDSCAPE NICHE:

In Western climates, use as an low-maintence, evergreen groundcover in full sun to shade.



CONTAINER APP:

Yes! Adds textural interest and unique color to large waterwise planters and mixed containers.
